



for the better as a result of what they learned in the course and over eight in ten participants felt that in-


formation they learned in the course has prevented them from being in a














Each Edition of the **Nautical News** will display a new image of the "Barber Bridge" so our membership can share and enjoy. These are normal sights in the backyard of the Vero Beach Power Squadron's Clubhouse, and is truly a reminder of the beauty of Vero Beach.

The *Merrill P. Barber Bridge* is a concrete arch bridge that spans the Indian River Intracoastal Waterway in Indian River County, Florida. The bridge was built by Odebrecht Contractors of Florida, Inc. and was completed in 1995. A fishing pier is constructed below the bridge on the east side.

The bridge is named for Merrill P. Barber, the mayor of Vero Beach from 1947 to 1949, and member of the Florida Senate from the 12th District from 1954 to 1958 and from the 29th District from 1963 to 1968.

The bridge has a total length of 3,834 feet (1,169 m) with a main span of 100 feet (30 m). The vertical clearance is 65 ft.

This newer bridge replaced the old Barber Bridge, built in 1951, which was concrete and had a steel bascule span. The older bridge was in constant state of disrepair and was removed, barged out to sea and sunk to become a reef. The steel bascule span was purchased by Disney and is in Orlando at the Walt Disney World theme park.

USPS--IMPORTANT MESSAGE ABOUT DANBoater member benefits

USPS (America's Boating Club) has arranged for its active members who are fully paid on Jan 1, 2020 to have the option of enjoying DANBoater benefits free until your membership renewal dues date. After that, you will have the option to continue coverage for \$25.00 per single or family membership per year when you pay your dues online. Go to the USPS website and click on the link for DANBoater (www.usps.org/DANBoater) to get your personal details. To download your membership card, view your membership info booklet and DANBoater guides you will need your USPS cert "E" number and your personal USPS pin number.

IMPORTANT PAYMENT INFORMATION!! (DURING THIS TRANSITION PERIOD)

- 1) DANBoater will only accept payment of the \$25 by credit card. Due to confusion at the start of this transition, if you paid your dues by check or credit card after Jan. 1st, 2020, you may not have had the option of paying for this benefit. You will need to click on the above link or call USPS HQ to pay that amount by credit card. Anyone who paid their dues before 1/1/20 should be covered but please check your status at the link or call USPS HQ at #888-367-8777—Tammy Brown X228. Your personal pin number was sent with your membership card.
- 2) For **new members** who joined after 12/31/19, you will need to go to the USPS website and click on the DANBoater link (**www.usps.org/DANBoater**) and pay by credit card or call USPS HQ numbers above to process your credit card.

What does DANBoater benefits cover?

It provides 24/7/365 days of medical and travel emergency hotline. <u>It will not cover your medical treatment and does not replace your medical plan.</u> For many more details about this plan, see **DANBoater.org/ABC/**

24 hour worldwide medical information and assistance (before or during your trip) DANBoater maintains a global database of physicians and medical facilities to assist members during an emergency. The Emergency Medical Evacuation must be arranged by DANBoater. Their Emergency hotline is #1-919-667-9111.

Emergency medical evacuation (up to \$150,000), by land, water or air and includes medical transportation, medical treatment, medical services or medical supplies during Medical evacuation, if medically necessary. This is as long as the main purpose of your trip is recreational and you are more than 50 miles from your residence. It also covers transportation of a traveling companion, family members and dependent children. (as long as it is medically necessary)

Repatriation due to emergency for hospitalization and follow up care. Search and Rescue Expense reimbursement up to \$25,000 in any 12 month period. Plus much more.









Youth Sailing Foundation Receives Grant from US Power Squadrons Educational Fund

Youth Sailing Foundation was honored recently with a grant from the United States Power Squadrons Educational Fund in recognition and support of YSF's afterschool sailing instruction offered free to the children of Indian River County. Fund Trustee/Secretary Nigel Hargreaves presented a check for \$7,500 to YSF Chairman Pat Harris at a waterfront ceremony attended by members of the local Vero Beach Power Squadron and YSF volunteers.





Organizations from all over the country vie for ten to twelve educational grants made by USPS each year. According to Mr. Hargreaves, this award marks the first USPS grant to a non-member organization, a high honor for YSF, which will use the award to fund one of its four after school squadrons in Fall 2020. The grant recognizes the educational value of YSF's programs, which seek to instill character, confidence, and valuable life skills in local children regardless of means, background or cir-

cumstances.

During the award presentation, members of the Beachland Shark Squadron were actively rigging and launching off the beach under the supervision of YSF Assistant Sailing Director Kym Helwig. These 4th and 5th grade sailors received a personal introduction to Mr. Hargreaves and expressed their thanks to him and the Educational Fund.

USPS, known to many as America's Boating Club®, has over 24,000 members organized into more than 350 local squadrons across the



country. Founded in 1914, the non-profit organization is dedicated to boating safety and education.

Youth Sailing Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit offering free sailing instruction to the children of Indian River County. This spring 175 sailors are enrolled in YSF programs, ranging from novice instruction to competitive scholastic sailing. The afterschool squadrons are drawn from several local public schools and represent all segments of the community, including many underserved families.
